



University of Tennessee at Chattanooga Honors College Articulation Agreement

The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga (UTC) and Motlow State Community College (MSCC) hereby enter into a partnership that promotes academic opportunity through this honors articulation agreement. This agreement between UTC and Motlow State Community College is to be periodically reviewed, and revised, if necessary, by the partner institutions.

General Articulation

Any interested student transferring to The University of Tennessee at Chattanooga from a credible honors program or college will be admitted to the Honors College at UTC via the Innovations in Honors Program, so long as the student meets the following criteria:

- a minimum of 3.25 GPA and
- verification of good standing from the director or Dean of the previous program.

All students entering the Honors College via IIH will need to complete the IIH application so that we have this additional background information.



Motlow State Community College Honors Program

Students transferring from MSCC Honors Program with the required 3.25 GPA and having completed their general education requirements (with an earned associate's degree) may enter the UTC Honors College in the Innovations in Honors (IIH) Program.

The IIH Program has these requirements:

1. Innovation Lab I (3 credit hours)
2. Innovation Lab II (3 hours)
3. Brock Seminar or other approved honors or experiential course (3 hours)
4. Departmental Honors Thesis or Honors College Thesis (4 hours)
5. UHON 2000 (1 credit hour)
6. UHON 3000 (1 credit hour)

MSCC's 21-hour Honors requirement, including the Honors Seminar (IDSH 1020, 1021, 1022, or


1023, 3 hours each), will satisfy requirement 3 above. Entering students will be required to complete requirements 1, 2, 4, 5 and 6.

All honors courses successfully completed at Motlow State Community College in other academic departments will articulate as relevant general education courses; they will also count toward the 24 hours of honors credit required for the Honors College diploma.

All U.S. permanent resident students not domiciled in the state of Tennessee who by way of an approved four-year honors curriculum are working toward the UTC Honors College diploma will receive a waiver for out-of-state tuition; this benefit may also apply to a limited number of international students to be decided on a case by case basis, when and if funding is available.

These equivalencies and admission requirements may be updated, as required, upon the formal approval of the Vice Presidents of Academic Affairs of both UTC and Motlow State Community College.






